Unit assessments



New Initiative... These are the bookmark learning questions. Children are to be given the 6 questions from the topic to be assessed on. They can be used at the start of a lesson to establish children's previous knowledge and understanding. These can be used throughout the topic as a review of learning and help to support embedded knowledge. The six questions can then be used at the end of the topic to assess the children's knowledge and understanding of that topic.



End of year assessments



New Initiative ... Two questions from each topic to be selected and the children share their knowledge and understanding of those questions. The children can choose how they wish to show their understanding, whilst being encouraged to record pictures, key vocabulary, phrases and sentences and also share their understanding verbally too.

A class list is created detailing whether the children are below, at or exceeding year group expectations ready for end of year reports to parents.
