




Add a child and a tree to the park. Talk about which one is tall and which one is short.

How can you tell?




Add 2 or 3 flowers to the park. Talk about which is tallest and which is shortest.

Choose an item for the park. Then add something taller, something shorter and something of the same height.

Can you find something that is the same height?

How can you tell?

Which of these are taller? Which of these are shorter?

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Questions to Extend and Deepen Understanding

While the children are completing the challenge, you may wish to ask them the following questions:

- Which is tall and which is short?
- How can you tell?
- Can you describe what you've added to the park?
- How do you know which is taller?
- Can you point to one that is shorter?
- Which is the tallest? Which is the shortest?
- How do you know these are the same height?
