Our Key Stage 2 pupils have been working really hard on their show, 'Wish We Were There'. The effort and commitment they've shown has been brilliant, and we look forward to seeing you there. As always the children make us so proud of the way they perform on the stage; we've definitely got some talented stars in the making!

I want to apologise for the mix-up with the show dates this week. Summer term is always hectic, and with everyone competing for hall time, things occasionally clash. Thanks so much to the parents who flagged the high school meetings – we don't always get those updates directly, so your heads-up really helps. We'll keep working on better coordination with our secondary colleagues.

There's been a fantastic world cup vibe around school. Year 3 even set up their own sweep stake, which has been great fun and got everyone engaged and cheering for their team!

This week, our Year 1 pupils and some Year 2 pupils have taken their phonics check. We're really proud of how hard they've worked and the progress they've made. They've shown real resilience, and it's clear we're building strong foundations in early reading.

Just a quick reminder about what comes into school – thanks for sticking with our rules about toys, teddies, and sensory toys. We've got sensory equipment in school if any child needs it for medical reasons. 




Attendance

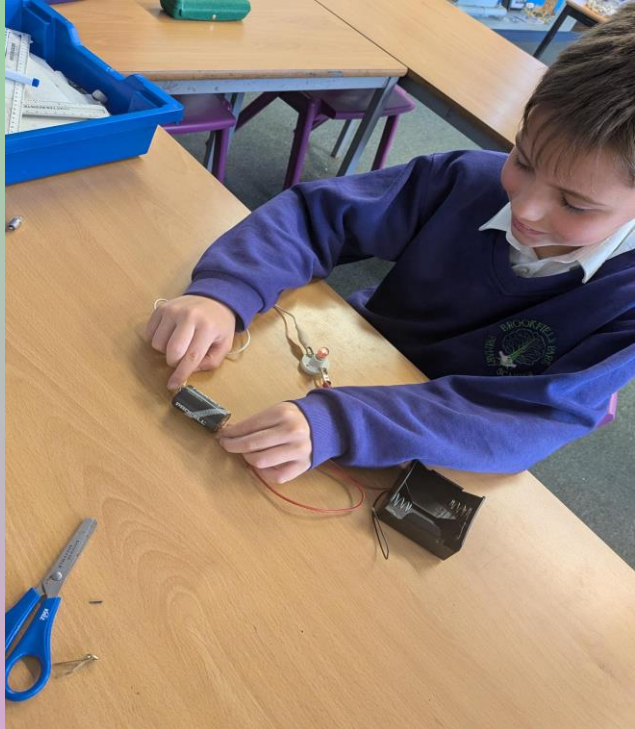
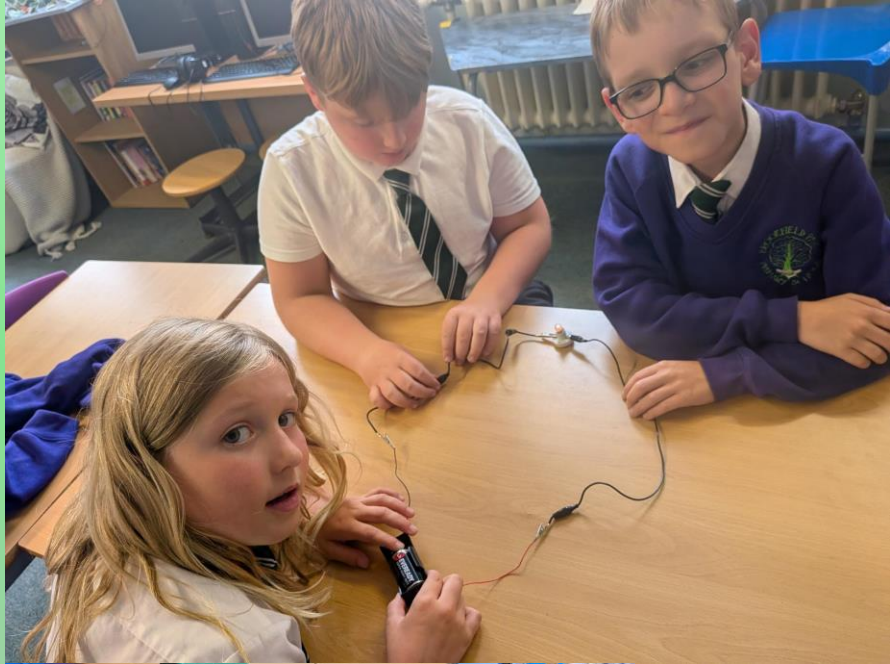
Year 1 have been recapping everything we have learned in Science this year in provision this week.



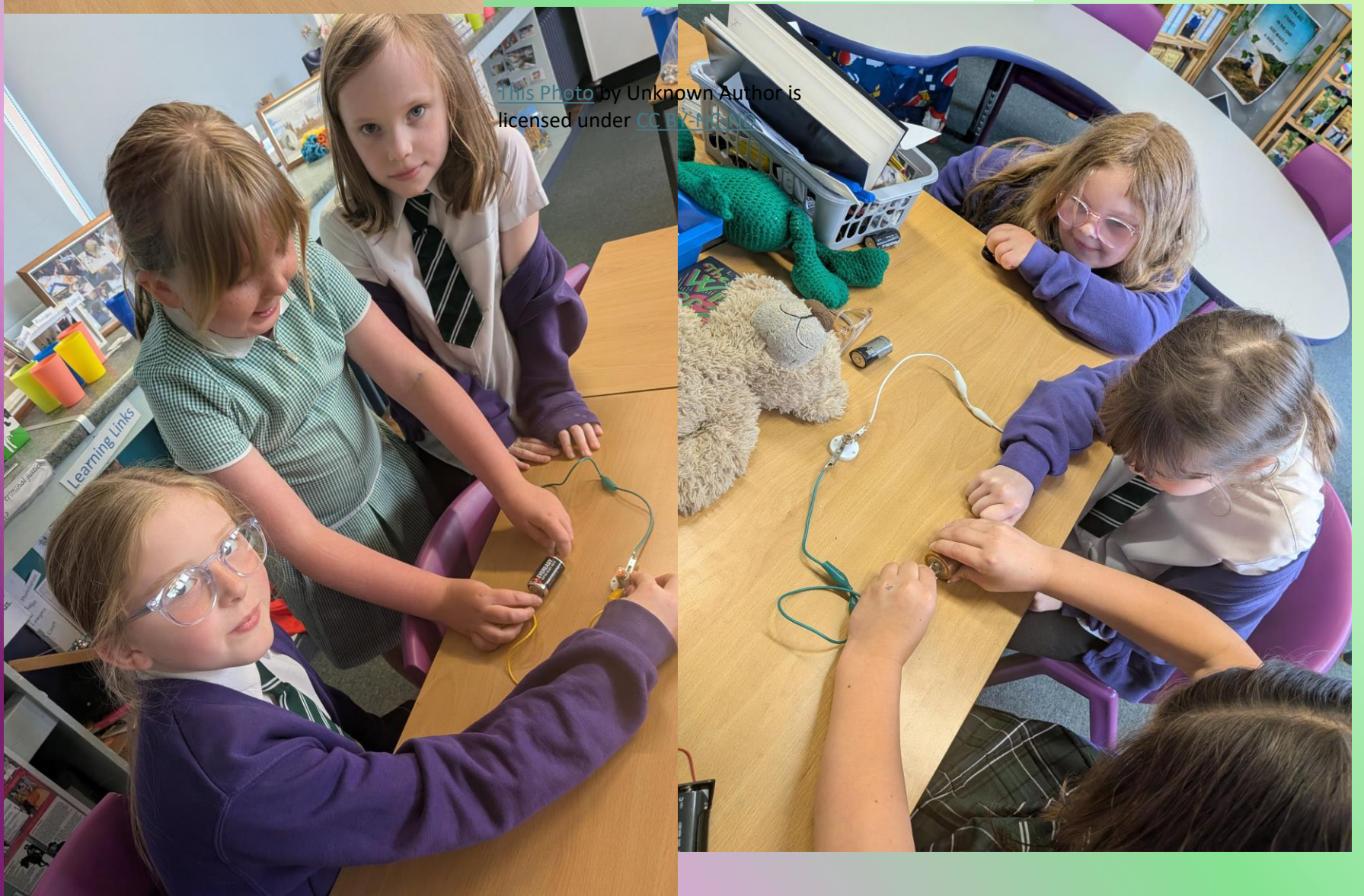
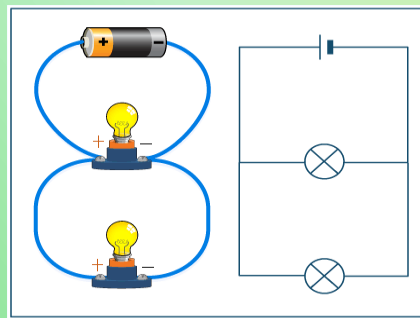


Our country for World Cup day in year 1 was New Zealand so we have tried some foods and done activities related to New Zealand today!



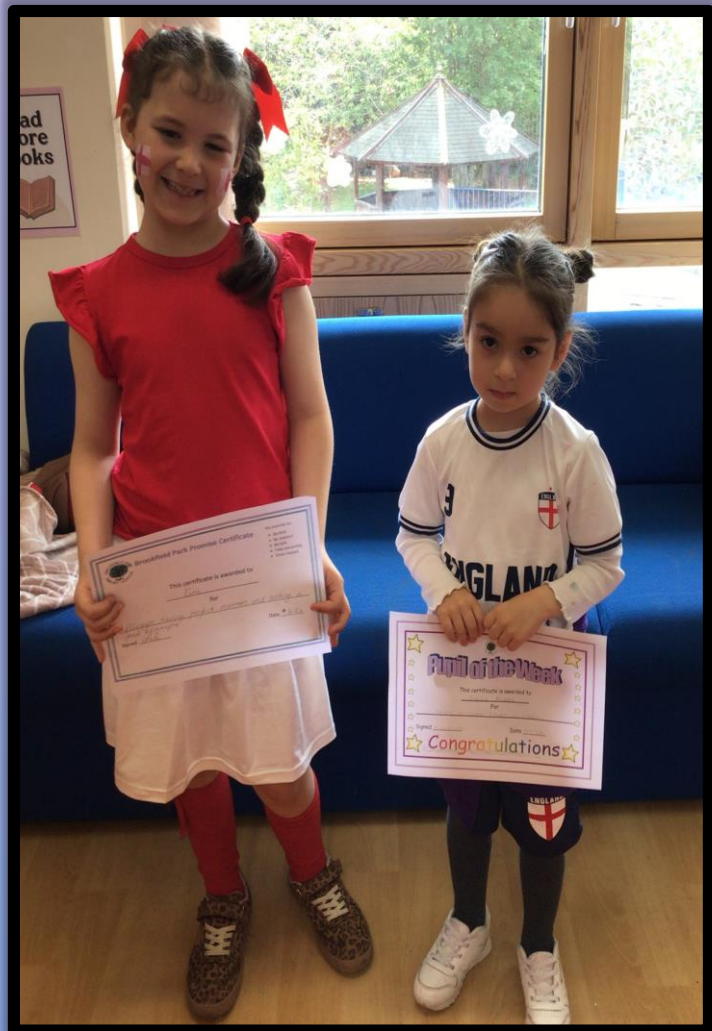


Year 4 science- Can they make a series circuit and make the bulb light up?
