Headteacher Update

This term is racing on with lots of learning and enrichment packed in. This week, pupils across the school have been engaged in assessments that serve an important purpose in our teaching cycle. These assessments help us to identify areas requiring further focus and provide valuable information about each pupil's starting points. This data proves invaluable for next year's teachers as they plan their provision and tailor their approach to meet individual needs.

I am pleased to introduce a new feature in our newsletter. Our Newsletter Club, led by Mr Deeming, will now be contributing their own insights and news to keep you informed about what is happening in school. The club members will also be profiling different members of staff, offering an interesting perspective on the people who work here at Brookfield Park. I hope you will enjoy reading their contributions.

Our Key Stage 2 production, 'Wish You Were Here', is progressing well and we very much look forward to welcoming families to the performances in a few weeks' time. Mrs Johanson will be providing further information about what pupils need to bring in, so please do look out for those details. Tickets are now available from the school office. Should you be unable to visit the office to purchase tickets, you may send money into school with your child in a named envelope clearly stating the number of tickets required and which performance you wish to attend.

Year 6 have been undertaking substantial writing activities this term, which enables Mrs Allard to report accurately on their attainment in this important area of the curriculum.

I am also pleased to report that we are running a variety of clubs this term, and the response from pupils has been very positive. The different club choices, including art club and book club, are proving popular and providing enriching experiences beyond the classroom.

As we move into the summer months, I would like to remind parents about practical considerations for outdoor learning. The weather remains unpredictable, so please ensure your child has a sun hat and sun cream available, as well as rainproof outerwear. This enables pupils to access outdoor provision regardless of the weather conditions.

Finally, a reminder regarding drinks brought into school. In line with guidance from the Department for Education, we ask that only water is brought into school, unless alternative drinks have been agreed previously due to a medical need. The DFE emphasises the importance of this measure, as sugary drinks throughout the day can contribute to tooth decay.






Attendance

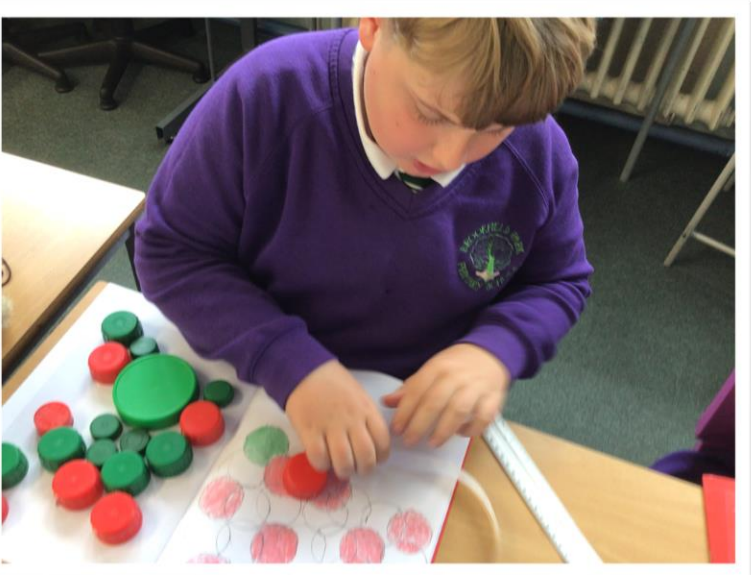

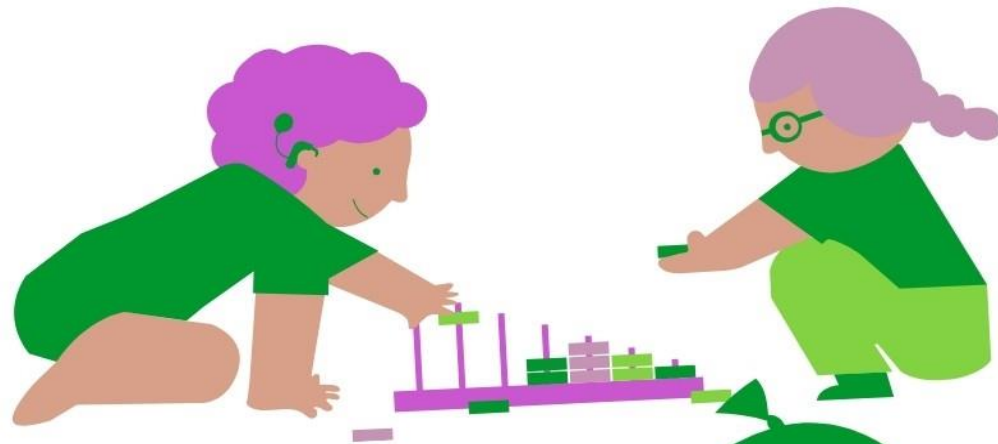
